Fougeron Architecture is a nationally recognized design firm whose work exhibits a strong commitment to clarity of thought, design integrity and quality of architectural detail. The firm's decidedly modernist attitude is the result of founder Anne Fougeron's vision to create a practice dedicated to finding the perfect alignment between architectural idea and built form. Her work can be defined by three basic tenets: Architectural space is modulated by the quality and character of the natural light; Innovative use of structure becomes the architectural ornament, and; Exploration into the visual and tactile nature of materials enhances how people engage a building. Fougeron's keen interest in crossing disciplinary boundaries has led the firm to develop a collaborative creative process that capitalizes on her relationships with craftsmen and artists who are experts in their fields. Each project undertaken by the office is an exercise in communicating not only design intent, but also in emotionally affecting those who inhabit them.

Iwamoto|Scott Architecture is a San Francisco based practice formed by Lisa Iwamoto and Craig Scott. Their work centers on amplifying the perceptual performance of architecture by designing strong environmental and site relationships, and innovative use of material. As a practice committed to pursuing architecture as a form of applied design research, they engage in projects at multiple scales and in a variety of contexts consisting of full-scale fabrications, museum installations and exhibitions, theoretical proposals, competitions and commissioned design projects. IwamotoScott's recent projects include: REEF, a design for PS1/MoMA Young Architects Program summer courtyard installation; Jellyfish House, a theoretical house design incorporating ambient technologies for the Vitra Design Museum and Art Center College of Design's show OPEN HOUSE; mOcean, a motion capture installation for SFMOMA, recently published in the 2005 ID Magazine Awards issue, IN-OUT Curtain; 2:1 House in Berkeley, California, and FOG House.

Mark Jensen is Principal of Jensen Architects, an award-winning architecture firm based in San Francisco. The firm is known for projects that are unique, appropriate, and poetic responses to the constraints and opportunities of each situation in which it works. In all projects, extreme care is taken to conceptualize comprehensively from the general to the particular so that the end effect conveyed is one of thorough and thoughtful consideration. The firm is interested in a critical approach to design, engaging contemporary culture and construction techniques in search of design solutions that are elegant, cost effective, and environmentally sensitive. Current projects include the new Sculpture Garden at the San Francisco Museum of Modern Art. Mark Jensen is an Adjunct Professor at the California College of the Arts (CCA) and is a former Chair of the Interior Architecture Department at CCA. He is currently Vice Chair of the Board of Trustees at the Headlands Center for the Arts.
